A Brief Report on the School in Wartime.

During the War, the boys assisted during vacations with forestry and agriculture, the delivery of mails, addressing of ration books, and clerical work in the Department of Inland Revenue. Between June, 1940 and July, 1945, accommodation was provided for the Staff and boys of The States of Guernsey School, exiled from their homes by the enemy occupation of the Channel Isles. All senior boys were taught First Aid and Anti-Gas Measures: a fully-equipped First Aid Post under the Medical Officer was manned throughout the War by Staff and boys, and this and the Air Raid Shelters were thrown open for public use as necessary. One-half of the permanent Staff joined H.M. Forces; the remainder, with temporary Masters, undertook all the Fire Watching at the School and also served throughout in the Home Guard, Special Constabulary and various Civil Defence Services. Large sums were raised for War Savings, the Red Cross, St. Dunstan's and War Relief, and parcels were sent regularly to all Old Boys who were prisoners in German hands. Close contact was maintained with the School's two adopted ships, the S.S. "Cowrie" and the S.S. "Sherwood," which served all over the world, and extensive libraries were established on both vessels. On numerous occasions, parties of Allied servicemen were welcomed and, despite wartime conditions, correspondence was kept up with Utica Academy, New York State, with which this School has forged many links of friendship. A large majority of senior boys voluntarily enrolled in pre-Entry Service Units, and the School established one of the first Flights of the Air Training Corps in the County, which still continues to perform valuable work.

Of the Old Boys and Staff, over 600 joined H.M. Forces, of whom thirty-four gave their lives for our freedom. Old Hulmeians were represented in every one of the theatres of the war; they served at the Admiralty, War Office and Air Ministry, with Fighter, Bomber, Coastal and Ferry Command, and with every branch of the Army, including the Staffs of the 1st, 5th, 8th, 9th, and 14th Armies. Between them, they accounted for seven U-Boats, several surface craft and twenty-four enemy aircraft destroyed. Twenty-two gallantry and other special decorations were won, including the C.B.E., D.S.O., O.B.E., M.B.E., D.S.C., M.C., D.F.C. and D.F.M., and there were twenty-seven Mentions in Despatches.

Due to the staunch devotion to duty of the Staff, the work of the School continued unabated, and the following summary amply bespeaks their effort.
